

Potential for protected species to be present within the forest. Pre-operational wildlife walkovers and surveys will be undertaken before felling or other forest operations commence. Sites will be managed according to buffers required and seasonal timings.

Kilmartin forest is a commercial conifer plantation planted from 1988-90. There are native broadleaves within the forest and along the watercourses. The management of Kilmartin Forest will take the approach of selective thinning, in-crop drainage improvement and phased fellings over the next 10 year period. Species selection for replanting will consider site suitability, landscape design and future commercial value.

Watercourses running through the forest lead into Loch Meiklie. All watercourses will be managed according to the Forest and Water Guidelines when forest operations are taking place

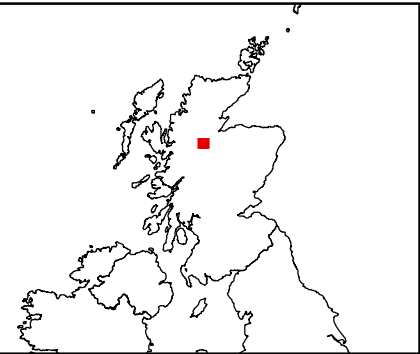
